Maths

Objective - Reinforcement of numeral 1 to 10.

Materials - Common objects available at home such as - toys, books, something from the kitchen, clothes, a bag etc.

How to go about it :-

1. Write and show a numeral at a time
2. Ask the child to pick up the number of objects associated to the number shown.

Eg: 1. Write numeral 2

The child speaks two and picks up 2 pencils.

Theme: Vocabulary development

Activity 1 - Reading a story

Objective :- Vocabulary development

Materials :- A storybook, crayons and blank sheets.

How to go about it

1. Read a story to your child and then ask him/her to draw a scene or a character from the story.
2. Help him/her narrate the same story in their own words.

Theme: Fun with time

Activity 2 - Reading a calendar

Objective :- Learning the days of the week and months of year

Materials :- A calendar of the current year.

How to go about it

1. Show the calendar to your child.
2. Ask your child
 - What day is it today? Eg. Saturday
 - What day was yesterday? Eg. Friday
 - What day will it be tomorrow? Eg. Sunday
3. Ask your child which month is going on. How many months are there in a year?
4. Which month is his/her birthday?

Note:- The activities given above are not compulsory. They are meant to keep the child constructively busy for some time during the day.
